## How it works:

- 1. Compete at the Pittsworth Show.

- 3. The Darling Downs Sub Chamber winner will progress to the State finals held at the Ekka.

Why ANZAC biscuits? Not only are they beloved Australian and New Zealand tradition, but they're also lowcost, easy to transport, and still require skill to perfect. Think you've got what it takes to create the ultimate ANZAC biscuit?

# Let's get baking!

## Conditions:

- 1. This competition is only open to ages 18-40 years as at 1st May of the year of competition.
- 2. Only one entry permitted.
- 3. After local show selection, the local show winner is to bake a new batch of biscuits for the Darling Downs Sub-Chamber Final Judging.
- 4. The ANZAC biscuits must use the supplied recipe below and must meet the State Final ANZAC Biscuit Basic Requirements listed below.
- 5. QLD Ag Shows Next Generation Competition Entry Form is to be completed Look for it on our webpage.

### State Final ANZAC Biscuits - Recipe and Presentation

- o 4 biscuits are to be presented for judging.
- o Biscuit size to be 5cm in diameter and crisp

# CWA Anzac biscuit recipe (Ingredients for 24 biscuits):

- 125gm butter, chopped
- 1 cup plain flour
- ½ tsp bicarb soda
- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 2 tbs golden syrup
- 2 tbs boiling water
- ¾ cup desiccated coconut

# Method:

Combine butter and golden syrup in a pan, stir over heat until butter is melted. Stir in combined soda and water, then remaining ingredients. Mix well. Drop rounded teaspoons of mixture about 4cm apart on greased over trays and flatten slightly.

Bake in a slow oven for about 20 minutes or until slightly brown. Cool on tray.

125g butter, 375g mixed fruit, 1 tsp mixed spice, 1 tsp bi-carb soda, 1 cup sugar, 1 dessert spoon marmalade, 1 cup cold tea or water, 2 well beaten eggs, 1 cup Plain flour, 1 cup SR flour, 1 tsp vanilla essence.

METHOD: Place water or tea, butter, fruit, marmalade, sugar, spice and soda into a saucepan, bring slowly to boil, boil for 2 mins. Remove from stove, cool a little, add eggs, vanilla and lastly sifted flour. Bake in 20cm round tin at 160°C for 1 hour or a little longer.
