

Horse Conditions of Entry

In addition to the Pittsworth Show Society rules and regulations listed at the front of the main schedule, the following will apply to this section:

1. Authority of the Chief Ring Steward

- The Chief Ring Steward will have the final say in all decisions regarding any event and entrance into events.
- o The Chief Steward may alter or remove any event within the Pittsworth Show Program.
- Any competitor or associated person displaying disruptive or offensive behaviour, at the discretion of the Chief Ring Steward, will be asked to leave the grounds immediately and will be excluded from further participation.

2. Biosecurity Requirements

- All Pittsworth Show Ring Events are conducted in accordance with relevant biosecurity guidelines.
- o All competitors must complete the required biosecurity documentation prior to competing.

3. **Ground Access**

All horses must enter the grounds via Bailey Street.

Stallions

4. Stallions

- No stallion or colt shall be allowed on the grounds without a bit or chain, and the handler must be over 17 years of age.
- o All vehicles, floats, and yards must have visible stallion or colt markers.
- Stallions or colts must be double tied to the float, and you must give ample room around your float parking.

Nominations

5. *On-Site Nominations*

Nominations will be available at the Show Office between 6:30 AM and 7:00 AM on Friday,
 7th March, and Saturday, 8th March.

6. Refund Policy

o Please choose carefully as there will be **no refunds** on entry tickets.

7. **Armbands**

o Competitors/exhibitors will receive armbands to wear for the duration of the show, indicating that indemnity and horse declaration forms have been completed.

8. Entry Tickets

- o A ticket matching the value of the entry fee must accompany each nomination for each event.
- o Tickets must be handed to the steward upon entering the judging arena and must include the correct class number, horse name, and rider name to be accepted.

Marshalling

9. Marshalling Requirements

- First call for competitors in any event will be five minutes prior to the program's scheduled time (if applicable).
- o Competitors should assemble with their horses in the marshalling area outside the gate entry to the judging arena in time for their event.

10. Classification of Entries

- Newcomers: A pony, Galloway, Hack, or horse that has not competed under saddle at any show or competition (excluding racing). Winners of Newcomer classes are not eligible for Champion.
- Maiden: A Pony, Galloway, or Hack that has not won a Hack class at an affiliated show. After winning a Maiden Hack class, the horse will be recognised as a Novice.

- Novice: A Pony, Galloway, or Hack that has not won an open championship at an agricultural show or a first at a royal show.
- o **Intermediate:** A horse that has not placed first, second, or third in a similar event at a royal show.

Height Requirements

11. Hacks

o Hacks must measure over **15 hands** and be able to produce an official height certificate.

12. Galloways

- o Galloways must measure over **14 hands and up to 15 hands** (inclusive).
- Horses measuring exactly 14 hands are classified as Ponies, and those measuring exactly 15 hands are classified as Galloways.
- o Ladies and Gents Galloway classes require riders to be 17 years or older.

13. *Ponies*

- o Ponies must measure up to and including **14 hands** and be able to produce an official height certificate.
- Ponies under **12.2 hands** must be ridden by children under 17 years.

Special Classes

14. Off the Track

o Open to all horses that have officially raced or completed a barrier trial.

15. Australian Heavy Horse Association (AHHA)

o Open to all members of the AHHA (proof of membership required).

16. Show Hunter

o Show Hunter entries are not eligible to compete in other hack classes.

17. Australian Stock Horse (ASH)

- o Working ASH classes must be ridden in a snaffle bit.
- o Competitors must hold current membership with the ASH Society.

18. Breed Classes

 All ponies and horses must be registered with the respective breed association, and registration papers must be available upon request.

District Qualifications

19. Eligibility

o Horses and competitors must reside within a 20km radius of Pittsworth, the Old Millmerran Shire, or be members of the Kurrajong Pony Club. Proof of eligibility must be produced upon demand.

Led Classes

20. Led Breed Classes

- o Proof of age, breeding, registration, and membership **must be produced** upon demand by the Chief Ring Horse Steward.
- o Horses with dual registration may compete in more than one class, provided they meet the requirements of the respective association's approval.

Protests

21. Protest Procedures

- o Disputes will be resolved under the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies' rules.
- The Chief Ring Steward shall have the power to ban from competition any competitor whose behavior to a judge and/or Chief Ring Steward is considered offensive by the judge, steward, or Chief Ring Steward.
- Protests must be submitted in writing within 30 minutes and accompanied by a \$100 bond, refundable only if the protest is upheld.

Age

22. Age Verification

o Riders must be able to produce proof of age in classes with age restrictions if requested by a steward.

o Acceptable proof includes a Queensland driver's license or an original copy of a birth certificate.

Measuring

23. Height Measurement

o All horses are required to be measured if necessary and must produce official height certificates upon request.

Stable Bookings

24. Stable Booking Procedures

- o Stable forms must be correctly completed and sent with proof of payment to Chief Ring Steward **Amanda Riehl** at amanda.riehl@outlook.com.
- o Full payment is required before stables are allocated.

25. Eligibility for Stables

o Competitors within a **50km radius** of the Showgrounds are not eligible for stables.

26. Stable Costs

o Cost: \$10 per stable for the duration of the show, plus a \$10 bond per stable.

27. Portable Yards

 Personal portable yard panels are allowed but must be approved with an application for space requirements.

28. Stallion Restrictions

o No stallions are allowed in stables per QCAS regulations.

29. Cleaning

o Stables must be cleaned on departure, with manure disposed of in designated areas. Bonds will not be refunded for uncleaned stables.

Other Rules

30. **Spectators**

- o Spectators, children, prams, or dogs are not permitted in the main arena.
- Only one handler per horse is allowed in the ring this is a workplace health and safety requirement.

31. Horse Vehicles

o Only horse vehicles are allowed on the grounds due to limited parking space.

32. **Insurance**

o The Pittsworth Show Society recommends all exhibitors have Public Liability Insurance to cover injuries or damages caused by their animals during the show.

33. Competitor Responsibility

- o Competitors compete at their own risk and must wear Australian Standard helmets while mounted on the grounds.
- o Appropriate attire and footwear must be worn in the arena.

Showjumping Conditions of Entry

General Rules

- 1. All events will be judged under Equestrian Australia (EA) Rules.
- 2. The Judge and the Steward reserve the right to change the program at any time.
- 3. All riders must wear helmets that comply with EA safety standards.
- 4. Competitors compete at their own risk.
- 5. All riders competing at the event must have read and accepted the Horse Conditions of Entry, Showjumping Conditions of Entry and the Disclaimer.

Nominations & Entries

- 6. All nominations must be made at the Show Office on the day.
- 7. A horse/rider combination may enter only one part of a combined class.
- 8. Horses may enter a maximum of 2 classes per day and only 1 Championship Class.
 - o If minimal entries, riders may be allowed to start in two Championship Classes (extra class to be determined on the day).
- 9. Class Combinations:
 - o Class 1A & 1B will run as one class.
 - o Class 2A & 2B will run as one class.
 - o Class 6A & 6B will run as one class.

Prizemoney & Presentations

- 10. All placegetters must present mounted for prizes, or prizemoney will be forfeited.
- 11. The Pittsworth Show Society Management Committee reserves the right to change prizes/prizemoney.

Event & Grounds Regulations

- 12. If there are fewer than 10 entries in any class, the Judge and the Steward reserves the right to combine or cancel the class.
- 13. Horse swabbing may be conducted in any official class.
 - Horses selected for swabbing must proceed directly to the swabbing box immediately after the presentation.
- 14. No extra vehicles will be allowed on the grounds due to space limitations.
 - o Parking attendants will be present to assist.
- 15. Gates open Friday and Saturday at 5:30AM.
- 16. Admission is payable by all individuals entering the showgrounds.
